A Public Hearing to receive public comments on the proposed use of Community Development Block Grant - CDBG-DR disaster recovery funds received from the Texas General Land Office for eligible infrastructure and acquisition/buyout proposed project directly related to Hurricane Harvey DR-4332.

Citizen Participation Guidance:

Most heavily impacted areas tied directly to Hurricane Harvey, that will benefit Low to Moderate Income Citizens.

1. City of La Marque's 2015-2022 Strategic Economic, Community Development Plan, and Citizen Participation Plan.

City of La Marque Allocation:

\$1,485,783.00 for Local Buyout and Acquisition Projects

\$1,447,527.00 for Infrastructure Projects

Eligible Projects Include:

Flood control/drainage projects, Acquisition/Buyout, Stormwater systems, Wastewater systems, Roads/streets, Community centers, Economic Development, Senior Citizen Activities, Job Training, Parks, and Public services/crime prevention.

Proposed Projects:

1. Westlawn Subdivision Stormwater Flood and Drainage Facilities remove/replace/rebuild the existing storm water drainage.
Proposed Cost: \$1,447,527.00
2. Acquisition of 40-acre tract on the Southwest side of I-45/Gulf Freeway for a stormwater runoff detention pond.
Proposed Cost: \$1,485,783.00

Low to Moderate Income Beneficiaries:

1. Woodlawn Subdivision infrastructure project will benefit approximately 77.88% of low to moderate city residents.
2. I-45/Gulf Freeway acquisitions project will benefit approximately 54% of low to moderate city residents.
