City Council Special Minutes of the City of La Marque City Council held on Monday, January 25, 2021, beginning at 6:00 p.m. at 1109-B Bayou Road with the following members present:

(1) CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Bell called the Special Meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

(2) ROLL CALL

(3) CITIZENS PARTICIPATION - There was none

(4) WORKSHOP

- a. Discussion relating to the current La Marque Police Department Collective Bargaining Agreement

City Manager Jackson said that the current Police Department Collective Bargaining Agreement (CBA) ends in September of this year. The workshop has been scheduled, not to be a negotiations meeting, but to answer questions about the existing CBA that Council may have relating to how different provisions are applied, and to understand the workings of the agreement or any specific items that are important to them in the CBA. Then he turned it over to City Council to discuss.

Some of the questions/ concerns discussed were as follows:

- Consistency at it relates to City Policy (section 5 page 17 - additional financial incentive-pay to employees who are residents of the City, and whether or not this was extended to all other employees outside of the Police Department) - clarification was that it pertains to Police and Fire only
- Payment for of training, certifications, recertifications to maintain current standings of the Police Officers, whether this is also covered for other city employees - clarification was yes, this does include other employees depending on job title and certification requirements
- Affirmative Action Program- is this in writing? - clarification - statement follows Federal laws and language (as it relates to sexual orientation)- will be, if not added in the Employee Handbook as well as this document, it will be updated as noted according to Federal laws
- Minorities- specific demographic referencing this? ("Minorities" not being descriptive enough)
- Vacation taken and accrued and value - **data was requested**
- Full cost for insurance for all employees - **data was requested**
- Sick leave pool- how it manifests- those who contribute an amount into the sick leave pool will be eligible after the committee reviews the request. Is sick leave taken reviewed? Is there a threshold? FMLA was briefly described, and the process of taking sick leave was discussed
- Police Cars being brought home that reside in the City and those who take vehicles home that do not live in the City - **data was requested**
- Explanation was given for the \$65.00 cost for ammunition and maintenance of uniforms/ replacement of boots, belts, etc. - ammunition is supplied for training purposes only
- City will reimburse up to \$500.00 for a firearm, otherwise each officer purchases his/her own firearm if cost is over
- Health and Safety Committee creation of a Physical Fitness Program - clarification as a quarterly assessment program and is volunteer and not mandatory, it is not required - it was asked how many officers are in the program, and what the program consists of- **date was requested**
- What it would look like to up the incentive - costs to \$500.00 if each officer were to be involved in the program - **data was requested**
- It was asked if a similar program existed within the Fire Department - clarification that this was in the process
- Expanding the physical and mental health portion of the CBA - page 44- (Chapter 143). It was asked that a more substantial support be offered to the Police Officers and all First Responders. **Data was requested** for costs associated of having counselors on-sight and available at any time and a better way to support them in this area
- A few areas that were suggested to be taken OUT of the CBA were (records retention, investigations, and disciplinary actions)

- Civilian oversight into the CBA – a suggestion was made to involve citizens to get involved and allow their input into the CBA negotiation process for more transparency
- It was asked that the union committee send any changes and or requests that they would like to be included in the negotiation process to the city Manager and he will get those out to the Council Members to begin reviewing
- It was asked why it was mentioned in the current CBA, how certain areas would supersede certain Chapters of 143, and 174 or any other Texas Statutes - Legal said that under the Charter, and has a Home Rule City, this CBA has the authority to pre-empt certain rules or sections, where the state has given a collective bargaining agreement the authority to trump certain places, that the current CBA has chosen to do so.
- Clarification was given on a section that authorizes the Police Chief to promote a Captain or an Assistant Chief outside of any promotional exam. Ultimately, City Council would still have to approve and fund this position.
- Clarification of Page 7, Section 5 had concerns of the wording of “at the discretion of management” to be able to revoke privileges that could also be applied to difference officers, it leaves room for favoritism. Is there a process and has it been reduced to a written policy? (example- taking a city vehicle home); it is said to be outlined in the Rules and Procedures of Investigation Policy.

Joshua Human, Patrol Sergeant and current the Union President- Page 9 Article 7 Section 3, the question of how any staff could “interfere” as it relates to this section? – **Mr. Human was asked to get back with the City Manager about what he finds out.**

- Overtime and how it was distributed was discussed. Availability based on whether the officer is off work, and or just got off duty is the method used to decide who works overtime. **Chief Jackson was asked to get back with Council on the possibility of certain officers receiving more opportunities for overtime then other officers. (Some type of list)**
- Seniority - for taking vacations - is there a system in place? It was said that there has never been a time where there have been any problems in this area.
- It was asked how vacation is accrued and carried over, and it was clarified that there will be one consistent process to deal with all aspects and be part of this CBA and will be included in the Personnel Manual. A “leave” Policy may be brought to City Council on its own then implemented into the Employee Personnel Manual that will have a maximum carry over.
- Every member of the Police Department is a member of the CBA

- Extra job – requirements to wear a uniform within the City while working extra jobs, this depends on the job and what that job requires, sometimes plain-clothes are required
- Article 33, Section 4, page 51- (Personnel files)- asked what a letter of counseling was – a written admonishment issued to an officer for a level of violation of a policy (that doesn't meet the level of a disciplinary action according to Civil Service) with-holding the letter from the file (if after investigations – proved be unfound); and after 6 mos. being able to ask that the letter be removed; (hearings and or third-party arbitration was explained by Chief Jackson.) Six months seemed like such a short time- as mentioned by a member of Council.
- Clarity was asked on records retention (types of violations that can be removed, and the amount of time lapsing before they can have them removed); Legal explained that there are a lot of overlaid laws tied into this (Civil Service Rules, Records Retention Laws, TCLOSE); Each document will have a different records retention requirement: (Disciplinary actions - suspension, demotion and termination) - Civil Service those are in the Employee Personnel File and are considered permanent
- Has a sworn notarized affidavit on a complaint always been required? (for Criminal misconduct, or specific violation of department rules) - under those categories, a sworn notarized affidavit complaint is required; are there any other avenues that a citizen can report their complaints to (yes, City Manager); Mr. Human explained the differences in the seriousness of kinds of complaints (official oppression, retaliation, rudeness, wrongful arrest); filing false complaints are an arrestable offenses. Citizens can go to any member of the Police Department, any Council Member or City Manager, and it was promised that all complaints regardless of where the complaints are turned into, will be investigated. Further discussion continued which included time frame for a complaint to be investigated, right to contact an attorney on both sides.

CLEAT Representative (John Kerr) was also on the call for any questions

- Time lapse from notice to the officer to be interviewed from a sworn complaint filed. "Reasonable" sounds vague but has defined legal standards. Mr. Kerr added that this is actually in the case of unreasonable situations, based on the time in which complaints are received. Is it situations, rather than reasonable situations. Is it reasonable for an officer to get legal representation at 2:00 in the morning?
- Holidays - rates and or compensatory pay was explained the accrual and/or taking time; options for compensatory/overtime (monetary ratio)

- Good control over this is important and make sure that this can be managed, to remain financial control. **How much overtime is a result of sick-leave- date was requested even if estimated.**
- There will be some written comments forthcoming from Councilmember Compian on the current CBA
- Military leave was clarified (not to exceed fifteen days per year); does this need to be increased? It was verified that this has never been an issue.
- Page 38-43 Safety and Equipment was clarified – officers are not allowed to take on extra jobs at establishments that receive more than 50% of their sales in alcohol, according to the Texas Association of Police Chiefs
- A question was asked was there not a zero tolerance to alcohol and alcohol abuse section in the CBA. (if found during random drug-testing, or involved in motor vehicular accident); it was said that there is zero tolerance in the Employee Personnel Manual

Councilmember Compian asked what the process was in the CBA negotiations. It was said to have this item on an upcoming agenda to form a negotiations committee to do this.

(3) CITIZENS PARTICIPATION

No one spoke

(4) NEW BUSINESS

- a. Discussion relating to adopting Resolution No. **R-2021-0004**, approving the aerial spraying of mosquitoes by Galveston County Mosquito Control District, as required on a yearly basis by the Federal Aviation Administration

After City Manager explained, it was clarified that the County has their own system and schedule of aerial spraying, then there was no other discussion

- b. Discussion relating to adopting Resolution No. **R-2021-0005**, designating members of the City Council as Representative and Official Alternate to the General Assembly of the Houston-Galveston Area Council for the year 2021

After City Manager explained, they discussed among themselves who would be willing to serve. No other discussion.

- c. Discussion relating to adopting Resolution No. **R-2021-0006**, authorizing the submission of a grant application for the First Responder Resiliency Program to the Office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division

After explanation by the Assistant City Manager Jordan, he introduced Karen Mc Whorter, of the Family Services Center of Galveston who was available for any questions.

- the grant requires a 20% match from the City
 - resources include four full-time counselors (rotating) available 24-hours
 - begins October of 2022
 - Specifically for first Responders and Peace Officers
- d. Discussion relating to ratifying the City Manager's approval of expenditures to Texas Pride Utilities for costs involved in emergency sanitary sewer rehabilitation in the amount of \$53,735.00

After a brief explanation provided by Public Works Director Mr. Cary, (this had been an ongoing problem for quite some time at that location)- issues were related to a long standing problem with a grease traps at one of the businesses in that area and lack of maintenance through the years – briefly discussed was what types of warranties did the City have on projects and contracts, it was said that it depends on what types of repairs but could be up to a minimum of fifty years on certain materials. A question was asked what the City could do to prevent something like this to happen again in the future, if a certain business or sub-division is putting extra stress or pressure, what is the cities stance? (Ordinances are in place, and the Capital Improvement Fund to repair those already worn out infrastructure);

- e. Discussion relating to approving a plat for Walgreens La Marque near 1832 FM 1765 with conditions: 1) that a corrected final plat is submitted to the City that includes the building setback lines for the C-1 General Commercial and Thoroughfare Overlay District zoning districts; 2) that a subordination agreement is submitted to the City; and 3) that original tax certificates are submitted to the City prior to filing of the plat

After a brief explanation provided by Development Services Mrs. Purnell, there was no other discussion.

- f. Discussion relating to adopting Ordinance No. **O-2021-0002**, amending the Delany Cove Planned Development District ("Delany Cove PDD") established by Ordinance No. O-2019-0026 by adding Section 14; and making other provisions related to the subject **THIS IS THE FIRST READING**

After a brief explanation provided by Development Services Mrs. Purnell, Councilwoman Mc Auliffe would like to see the their plans for what kinds of trees they are going to plant.

- g. Discussion relating to adopting Ordinance No. **O-2021-0003**, amending the fiscal year 2020-21 Budget for 1764 Water Plant Pumps project by increasing various accounts expenditures and revenues as set forth in Exhibit A **THIS IS THE FIRST READING**

City Manager Mr. Jackson gave an overview of the problems associated with water pressure in the area around the 1764 Water Plant. The water plant was built around 1990. Several subdivisions and other large developments have been constructed since then, and that plant is no longer capable of meeting the demand of water supply needs. This item falls under the ability to fund this from Impact Fees. City Engineer Dinh Ho, added information about the pump improvements to the booster pumps (below)

- h. Discussion relating to approving Precision Pumps System's quote for pump improvements to the booster pumps at the 1764 Water Plant, not to exceed \$225,000.00, and authorizing the City Manager to execute contract documents and/or purchase orders necessary to complete this purchase under the City's interlocal agreement with BuyBoard

Keeping a master list of membership and member ongoing- will be done in-house. Staff is working on a handbook for all Boards and Commissions.

ORDINANCE NO. O-2021-0002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE DELANY COVE PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (“DELANY COVE PDD”) ESTABLISHED BY ORDINANCE NO. O-2019-0026 BY EXTENDING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE PDD TO INCLUDE SECTION 14 OF LANDING AT DELANY COVE; AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AND ZONING MAP TO REFLECT THIS AMENDMENT; PROVIDING A PENALTY IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of La Marque, Texas, (the “City”) heretofore adopted Ordinance No. 953, as amended, codified in Chapter 71, Zoning, of the City Code of La Marque Code of Ordinances (the “Zoning Ordinance”) that regulates and restricts the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and other purposes, and provides for the establishment of zoning districts of such number, shape and area as may be best suited to carry out these regulations; and

WHEREAS, Section 71-18 of the Zoning Ordinance provides for the creation of Planned Development Districts for, among other types of development, housing development on tracts of five acres or more; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. O-2019-0026 established the Delany Cove Planned Development District (“Delany Cove PDD”) approximately 40.7 acres of land comprised of Sections 11, 12 and 13 of Landing at Delany Cove; and

WHEREAS, Friendswood Development Company (the “Owner”) applied to have Delany Cove PDD amended by adding Section 14 of Landing at Delany Cove to the Delany Cove PDD; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission recommended approval of this amendment to the Delany Cove PDD following a public hearing on January 26, 2021; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds, following notice and public hearings as required by law, that the proposed amendment to the Delany Cove PDD is consistent with the City’s comprehensive plan, and that the comprehensive plan of the City should be amended to include the proposed amendment to the Delany Cove PDD;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS:

Section 1.

That the facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are found to be true and correct.

Section 2.

That the boundaries of the Delany Cove PDD established by Ordinance No. O-2019-0026, are hereby amended to also include Section 14 of Landing at Delay Cove, as shown in Exhibit A. The zoning regulations contained in Ordinance No. O-2019-0026 and this Ordinance shall be applicable to the Delany Cove PDD.

Section 3. Zoning Map

The official zoning map of the City of La Marque is hereby amended in accordance with this Ordinance.

Section 4. Comprehensive Plan

The City's comprehensive plan is amended in accordance with this Ordinance.

Section 5.

The development of the property (Delany Cove Sections 11, 12, 13 and 14) shown in Exhibit A shall conform to all requirements for the R-1 Single Family Residential Zoning District and any other requirements applicable to all zoning districts or uses within any zoning district, as prescribed by the Zoning Ordinance, except for the following modifications:

Lot size. A lot in this district shall not be less than six thousand (6,000) square feet in area and shall not be less than fifty feet (50') wide at the building line; however, a lot for a single-family dwelling in this district may be less than six thousand (6,000) square feet in area, provided that lot is not less than one hundred twenty feet (120') in depth and not less than fifty feet (50') at the building line.

General Open Space Requirements. The development of the property within the Delany Cove PDD shall include a minimum of 23% of open space to mitigate the higher density allowed in the Delany Cove PDD; provided, however, the development of Section 14 shall include a minimum of 50% open space which may be satisfied by the improvement with landscaping and walking trails of the on-site detention/retention pond. Open space may also include pocket parks, improved ponds, walking trails, fountain areas and nature preserves, in substantial compliance with the landscape and concept plan, attached as Exhibit B.

Section 6.

Nothing in this Ordinance waives or modifies any other City requirement, including but not limited to off-street parking requirements unless expressly referenced herein, subdivision regulations, and construction codes. Approval of this Application grants only the rights specifically addressed herein and does not constitute subdivision plat approval; provided, however, any previously approved General Plan for Landing at Delany Cove is hereby modified only to the extent that Section 14 is added to the General Plan. In the event of any conflict between this Ordinance or a previously approved General Plan, the most restrictive plan, or most expansive landscaping or improvements shown on either plan shall apply.

Section 7. Penalty

As provided in Section 71-5 of the City Code, any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance or who shall fail to comply therewith or with any of the requirements thereof, or who shall erect or alter any building, or who shall commence to erect or alter any building in violation of any detailed statement of the plan submitted or approved thereunder, shall for each violation or noncompliance be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined as provided in section 1-10 of the City Code.

Section 8. Effective Date and Publishing

This ordinance shall be effective immediately, except where a later date is expressly provided, upon adoption on second and/or final reading after publication and hearing, as provided in Sections 2.17-2.19 of the Charter of the City of La Marque, and publication in accordance with Section 52.013 of the Texas Local Government Code.

Section 9. Conflict and Repeal

This ordinance is intended to be cumulative and shall not repeal any previous ordinances except to the extent of an irreconcilable conflict.

Section 10. Severability

In the event any clause, phrase provision, sentence, or part of this ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this ordinance as a whole or any part of the same, notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.

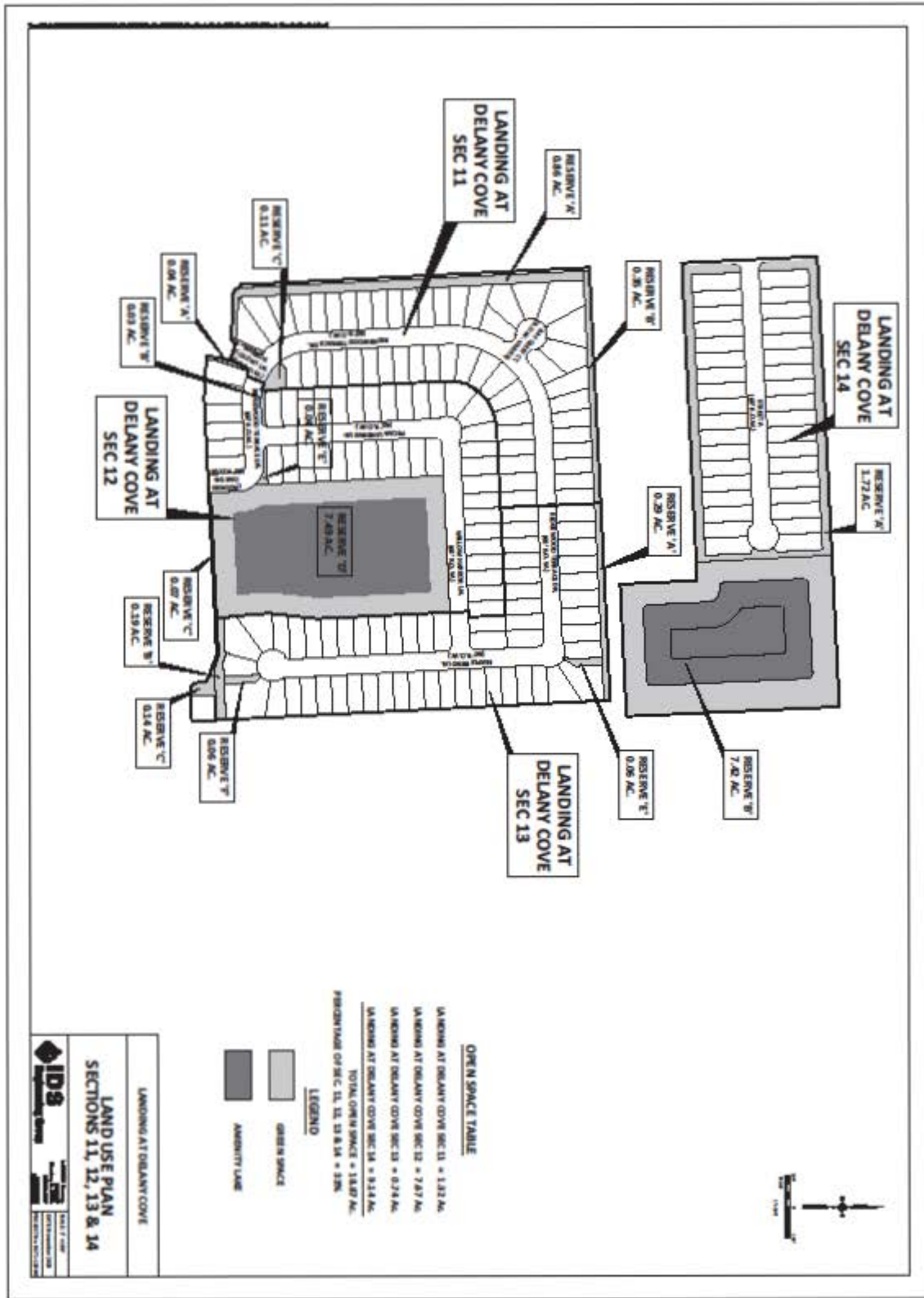

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, ESTABLISHING THE DELANY COVE PLANNED DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT (“DELANY COVE PDD”) AS A ZONING DISTRICT IN ACCORDANCE WITH CHAPTER 71, ZONING, OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE CODE OF ORDINANCES; ADOPTING REGULATIONS APPLICABLE TO THE DELANY COVE PDD; AMENDING THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO REFLECT THIS AMENDMENT; AND PROVIDING A PENALTY IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$2,000 FOR EACH VIOLATION.

WHEREAS, Section 71-18 of the City of La Marque Code of Ordinances (“City Code”) provides for the creation of Planned Development Districts for, among other types of development, housing development on tracts of five acres or more; and

WHEREAS, Friendswood Development Company (the “Owner”) is the owner of approximately 40.7 acres of land comprised of Sections 11, 12 and 13 of Delany Cove, as shown on Exhibit A (the “Property”); and

WHEREAS, the Owner of the Property has presented an application for the City to establish the Delany Cove PDD in order to further construction, operation and use of a master planned community; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with Sections 211.006 and 211.007 of the Texas Local Government Code, notice was mailed to all property owners within 200 feet of the Property, and the school district in which the Property is located, prior to the public hearing before the Zoning Commission on October 8, 2019; and

WHEREAS, the Zoning Commission held a public hearing on its preliminary report and issued a final report on October 8, 2019 recommending that City Council establish the Delany Cove PDD and adopt zoning regulations applicable to the Delany Cove PDD as provided in this Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the City Council finds, following newspaper publication and the required public hearings, that the proposed Delany Cove PDD is consistent with the City’s comprehensive plan, and that the comprehensive plan of the City should be amended to include the proposed Delany Cove PDD;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the facts and matters set forth in the preamble of this Ordinance are found to be true and correct.

Section 2. That the application to establish the Delany Cove PDD is hereby approved subject to the regulations, restrictions, terms and conditions set forth in this Ordinance, and shall include the Property, as shown in Exhibit A.

Section 3. That the City's comprehensive plan is amended in accordance with this Ordinance.

Section 4. That the following regulations, including the regulations applicable to the R-1 Single Family Zoning District and any other zoning regulations applicable to all zoning districts or uses in any zoning district, shall apply to uses in the Delany Cove PDD (zoning district):

Delany Cove Planned Development District (Delany Cove PDD). The development of the Property (Delany Cove Sections 11, 12 and 13) shown in Exhibit A shall conform to all requirements, including the authorized uses, for the R-1 Single Family Residential District and any other requirements applicable to all zoning districts or uses within any zoning district, as prescribed by Chapter 71, Zoning, of the City Code, except for the following modifications:

Lot Size. A lot in this district shall not be less than six thousand (6,000) square feet in area and shall not be less than fifty feet (50') wide at the building line; however, a lot for a single-family dwelling in this district may be less than six thousand (6,000) square feet in area, provided that lot is not less than one hundred twenty feet (120') in depth and not less than fifty feet (50') at the building line.

General Open Space Requirements. The development of the Property shall include a minimum of 23% of open space to mitigate the higher density allowed in the Delany Cove PDD. This open space may include pocket parks, ponds, walking trails, fountain areas and nature preserves, in substantial compliance with the land use and concept plan, attached as Exhibit B.

Section 5. Nothing in this Ordinance waives or modifies any other City Code requirement, including but not limited to off-street parking requirements, subdivision regulations, and construction codes. Approval of this Application grants only the rights specifically addressed herein.

Section 6. **Penalty.** As provided in Section 71-3 of the City Code, Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance or who shall fail to comply therewith or with any of the requirements thereof, or who shall erect or alter any building, or who shall commence to erect or alter any building in violation of any detailed statement of plan submitted or approved thereunder, shall for each violation or noncompliance be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction, shall be fined as provided in section 1-7 of the City Code. The owner of that building or premises or part thereof where anything in violation of this chapter shall be placed or shall exist, and any architect, builder, contractor, agent or corporation employed in connection therewith who may have assisted in the commission of any such violation shall be subject to the penalties herein provided.

Section 7. **Effective Date and Publishing.** This ordinance shall be effective immediately, except where a later date is expressly provided, upon adoption on second and/or final reading after publication and hearing, as provided in Sections 2.17-2.19 of the Charter of the City of La Marque, and publication of this ordinance or a caption that summarizes the purpose of this ordinance and the penalty for violating this ordinance in every issue of the official newspaper for two days, or one issue of the newspaper if the official newspaper is a weekly paper, in accordance with Chapter 52 of the Texas Local Government Code.

Section 8. **Conflict and Repeal.** This ordinance is intended to be cumulative and shall not repeal any previous ordinances except to the extent of an irreconcilable conflict.

Section 9. **Severability.** In the event any clause, phrase provision, sentence, or part of this ordinance or the application of the same to any person or circumstance shall for any reason be adjudged invalid or held unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, it shall not affect, impair, or invalidate this ordinance as a whole or any part of the same, notwithstanding the omission of any such part thus declared to be invalid or unconstitutional, whether there be one or more parts.

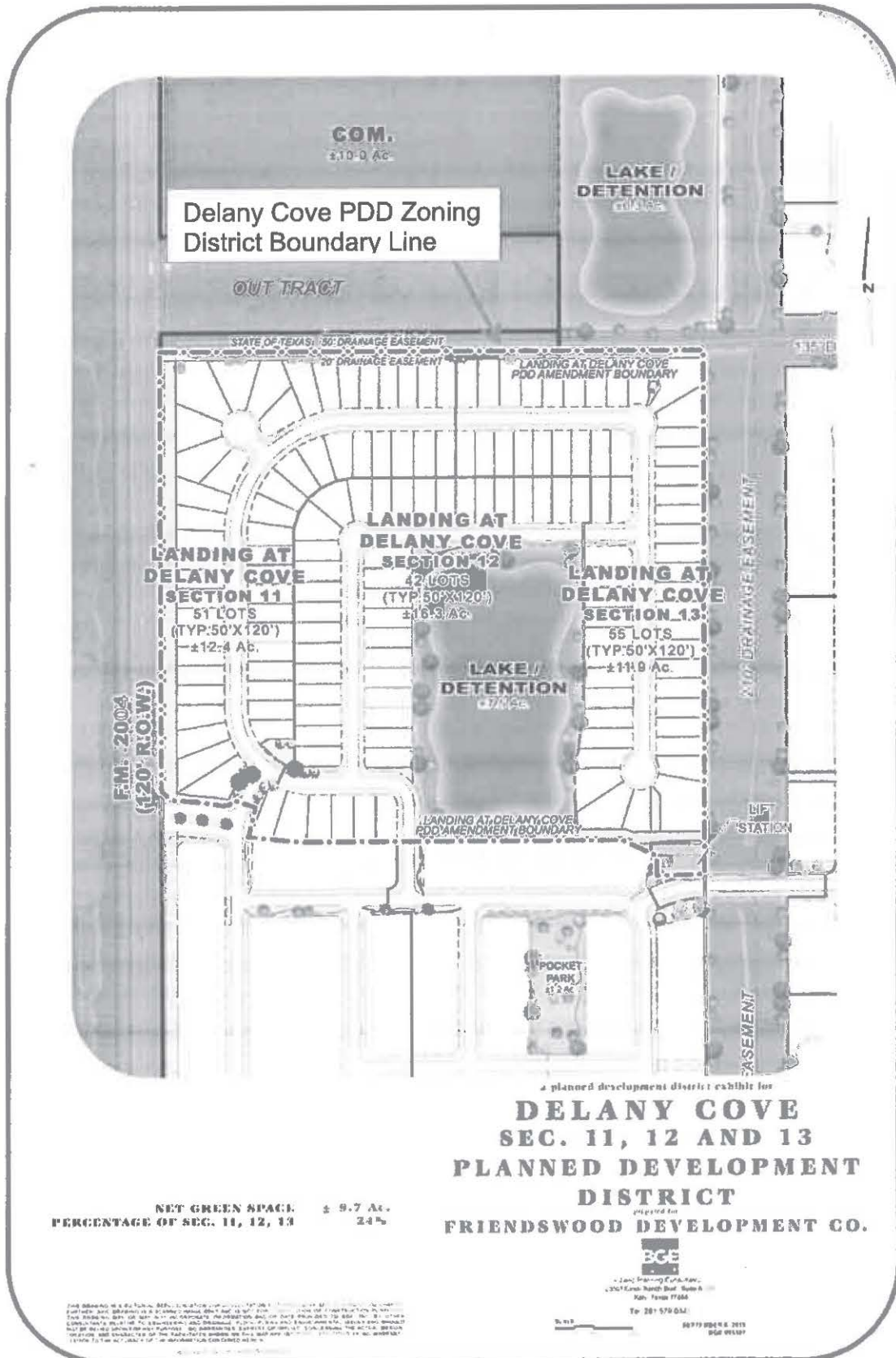

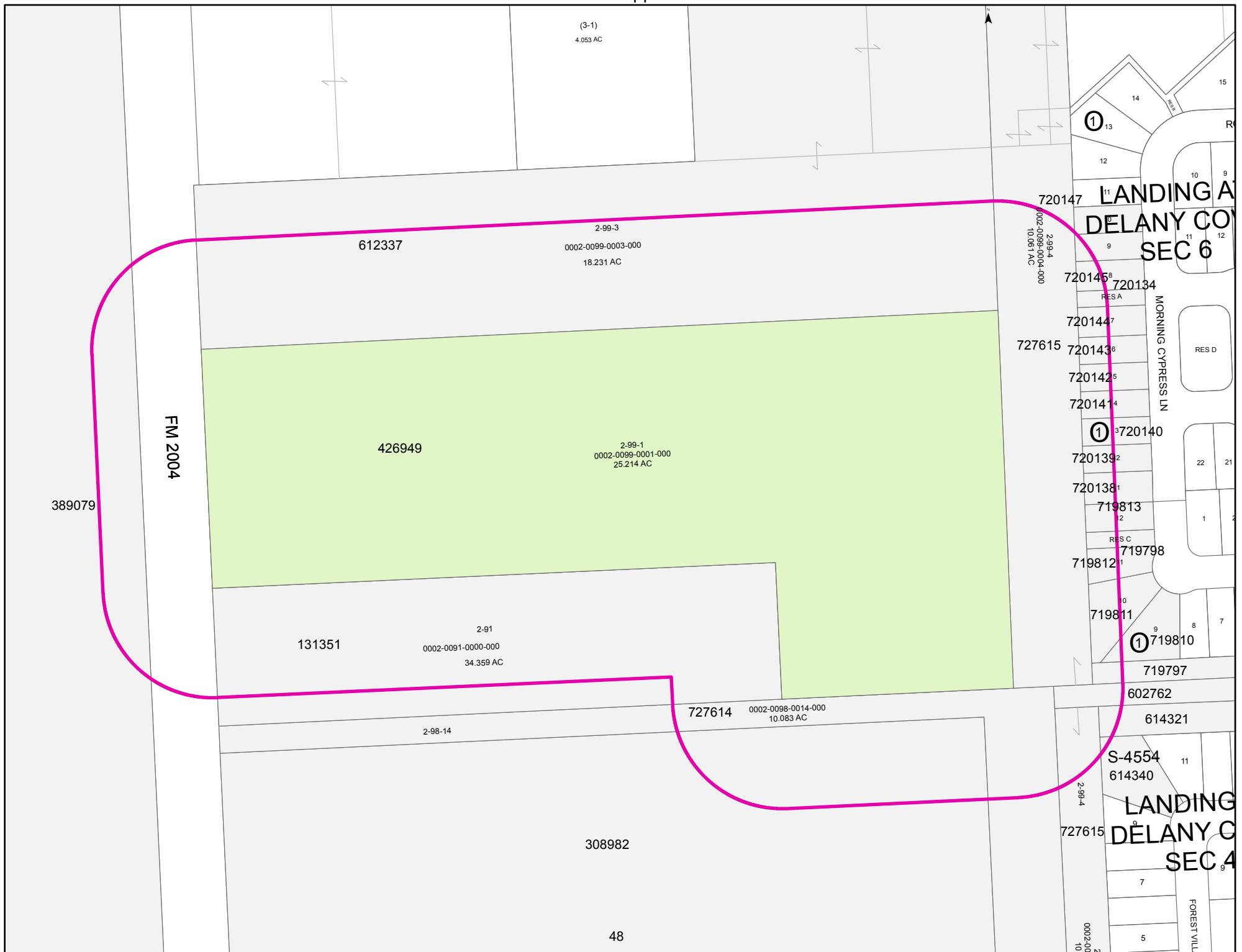

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF LA MARQUE 2020-21 BUDGET FOR 1764 WATER PLANT PUMPS PROJECT BY INCREASING VARIOUS BUDGET ACCOUNTS, EXPENDITURES AND REVENUES AS SET FORTH IN ATTACHED EXHIBIT “A” BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That the City La Marque 2020-2021 Fiscal Year Budget is hereby amended for 1764 water plant pumps project by increasing various accounts’ expenditures and revenues as set forth in Exhibit “A” attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Section 2. City Council finds that the 1764 water plant pumps project is a facility expansion and/or capital improvement contained in the City’s adopted Capital Improvements Plan as a portion of the GCWA Water Supply Capacity Purchase to service 10 year growth due to the location of the take-point and necessity for the increased capacity of booster pumps in order to supply the purchased water to accommodate 10 year growth in accordance with Chapter 395 of the Texas Local Government Code.

Section 3. Open Meetings Act. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 2.9, "ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES" OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE CODE OF ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 2.9, Establishing a policy for appointments to boards, commissions and committees," of Article I, "In General," of Chapter 2, "Administration", of the City of La Marque Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2-9. - Establishing a policy for appointments to boards, commissions and committees.

- (a) *Scope of this policy.* Standing boards, commissions and committees addressed by this policy shall be referred to as "committees", in the interest of brevity. Those committees addressed by this policy are:

Building Standards Commission (See Sec. 14.280)

Keep La Marque Beautiful Commission (See Sec. 35-45)

La Marque Economic Development Corporation

Library Advisory Board (See Sec. 2.37)

Civil Service Commission (See Sec. 2.306)

La Marque Cemetery Board (See Sec. 2.312)

Parks Board (See Sec. 2.209)

Planning and Zoning Board (See Sec. 71.24)

Board of Adjustments (See Sec. 71.25)

- (b) *Initial assignments of positions and changes.*

- (1) Each member position on each of the itemized committees are hereby assigned to a council district or the mayor as indicated on "Attachment A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference. The "city council" as used herein shall also include the position of mayor.
- (2) The city council may amend the district assignments at any time by simple motion and approval at any called city council meeting where the subject is posted as a part of the agenda according to law. District assignments and future changes to those assignments shall be maintained by and kept in the office of the city clerk.

(c) *Nominations and appointments.*

- (1) *Notice.* Ninety days prior to the expiration of an appointed term, or immediately after being notified of a mid-term vacancy on any committee, the city clerk shall notify the council member whose district is assigned the position in question, that a vacancy will be or is open on that committee. Included with that notice will be any candidates for nomination that the committee itself may have recommended, any qualifications for the position that may be established by Charter or ordinance, and the meeting schedule of the relevant committee. A copy of the notice shall be provided to all members of the city council at the same time. Further, the City Clerk shall notify the current committee member ninety days prior to the expiration of their appointed term and request the member complete a new application if they desire to continue serving in the same capacity for an additional term. AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, AMENDING SECTION 2.9, "ESTABLISHING A POLICY FOR APPOINTMENTS TO BOARDS, COMMISSIONS AND COMMITTEES" OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE CODE OF ORDINANCES; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS:

Section 1. That Section 2.9, Establishing a policy for appointments to boards, commissions and committees," of Article I, "In General," of Chapter 2, "Administration", of the City of La Marque Code of Ordinances is hereby amended to read as follows:

"Sec. 2-9. - Establishing a policy for appointments to boards, commissions and committees.

- (a) *Scope of this policy.* Standing boards, commissions and committees addressed by this policy shall be referred to as "committees", in the interest of brevity. Those committees addressed by this policy are:

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Keep La Marque Beautiful Commission (See Sec. 35-45)

La Marque Economic Development Corporation

Library Advisory Board (See Sec. 2.37)

Civil Service Commission (See Sec. 2.306)

La Marque Cemetery Board (See Sec. 2.312)

Parks Board (See Sec. 2.209)

Planning and Zoning Board (See Sec. 71.24)

Board of Adjustments (See Sec. 71.25)

- (b) *Initial assignments of positions and changes.*

- (1) Each member position on each of the itemized committees are hereby assigned to a council district or the mayor as indicated on "Attachment A" which is attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference. The "city council" as used herein shall also include the position of mayor.
- (2) The city council may amend the district assignments at any time by simple motion and approval at any called city council meeting where the subject is posted as a part of the agenda according to law. District assignments and future changes to those assignments shall be maintained by and kept in the office of the city clerk.

(c) *Nominations and appointments.*

- (1) *Notice.* Ninety days prior to the expiration of an appointed term, or immediately after being notified of a mid-term vacancy on any committee, the city clerk shall notify the council member whose district is assigned the position in question, that a vacancy will be or is open on that committee. Included with that notice will be any candidates for nomination that the committee itself may have recommended, any qualifications for the position that may be established by Charter or ordinance, and the meeting schedule of the relevant committee. A copy of the notice shall be provided to all members of the city council at the same time. Further, the City Clerk shall notify the current committee member ninety days prior to the expiration of their appointed term and request the member complete a new application if they desire to continue serving in the same capacity for an additional term. The City Clerk shall provide a copy of the committee member's application, response, or lack thereof, to the council member whose district is assigned the position in question within 30 days of making the request to the committee member.
 - (2) *Nominations.* A council member shall have 60 days from receiving the city clerk's notice of a vacancy or pending vacancy for a position assigned to that council member to provide the name of a nominee to the city clerk to be presented to the full city council for consideration of appointment at the next regular scheduled city council meeting following the 60 days. ORDINANCE NO. O-2021-0005

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, PRESCRIBING THE TYPE OF NOTICE TO BE GIVEN FOR PUBLIC HEARINGS ON LARGE SCALE UPDATES AND CORRECTIONS TO THE CITY'S ZONING MAP PURSUANT TO CITY CODE CHAPTER 71 AND TEXAS LOCAL GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 211.006; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of La Marque, Texas, (the "City") previously adopted Ordinance No. 953, as amended, codified in Chapter 71, Zoning, of the City Code of La Marque Code of Ordinances (the "Zoning Ordinance") that regulates and restricts the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and other purposes, and provides for the establishment of zoning districts of such number, shape and area as may be best suited to carry out these regulations, pursuant to Chapter 211 of the Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, large-scale updates and corrections to the City's adopted zoning map may be necessary from time to time; and

WHEREAS, the Planning and Zoning Commission will consider such corrections and updates to the zoning map and is expected to issue a preliminary report on March 16, 2021 in an open meeting, then hold a public hearing on such report at the next Planning and Zoning Commission meeting prior to issuing a final report and recommendation to City Council;
