Commissioner Rebecca Mould made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 11 Regular Meeting. Commissioner Alanah Brown seconded the motion.

(5) PRESENTATIONS

- a. Presentation of the Good Neighbor Awards
Chairman Compian announced recipients of the Good Neighbor Awards as Andrew Berry, Amanda Leyva Kleinschmidt, Kinsey Armstrong, Roy Birkleback, Russell Dalton, Vickie Edwards, Candace Gunn, Trisha Hayman, Donna Heinrich, Ben Keith, Sarah Kimbrough, Lindsey Berry, Nada Linic, Dalia McBeth, Kathy Modzelewski, Julie Molis, Marilyn Peloquin, Erica Puccetti, Jeanie Reida, Pat Redwine Trevisani, Vivian Kleinschmidt, Lindsey Watson and Phil Young. Commissioner Katherine Herrin discussed the recipients.

Chairman Compian welcomed Commissioner Mould as a member of the commission. Commissioner Mould discussed her background and her time in La Marque.

No citizens requested to address the commissioners.

(7) MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

Commissioner Brown presented the Financial Reports for February, March and April 2020. Commissioner Brown made a motion to accept the reports. Commissioner Tracie Steans seconded the motion. Chairman Compian noted the amount of voluntary contributions in January. **MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY**

(8) OLD BUSINESS

- a. Discussion/possible action regarding Keep Texas Beautiful and Texas Department of Transportation Governor's Award Results
Chairman Compian noted that KLMBC placed second in its category in the Governor's Awards. Compian also discussed the commission's progress in the awards over the past years and complimented the board. Commissioner Brown stated she was excited to share the commission's Silver Certificate online. Compian stated that the awards dinner is tentatively scheduled for September 29 in Houston, and that the conference may be broadcast on videoconferencing.
NO ACTION WAS TAKEN

- b. Discussion/possible action regarding nominations for the Good Neighbor Award
Chairman Compian discussed the Good Neighbor Award program and asked that commissioners seek nominees of individuals in the community who help others in La Marque. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

- c. Discussion/possible action regarding nominations for the Residential Yard of the Month
Chairman Compian asked about past yards recognized due to the delay. Commissioner Steans said that the commissioners are picking up signs from the old winners. Compian asked if there are no new yards. Commissioner Brown said there are no new yards but that yards will be nominated again as the commission is resuming meetings. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**



- d. Discussion/possible action regarding nominations for the Business Yard of the Month

Chairman Compian asked if the situation was the same as with the Residential Yard of the Month. Commissioner Brown said it was. Compian asked that any commissioners with nominations contact Commissioner Steans. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

- e. Discussion/possible action regarding the Monthly Report from Waste Management

Revitalization Specialist Garrett Bryce stated that the reports were for February, March and April. Commissioner Brown stated that the reports were consistent in numbers as far as recycling and trash collection. Brown said that there was an uptick in trash collected over recycling collected and the impact of COVID-19 on collections. Chairman Compian said he had understood that there were increases in collections due to more people being home and ordering items online. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

(9) NEW BUSINESS

- a. Discussion/possible action regarding the creation of a Community Resource Online Page/Post, including COVID 19 Resources

Chairman Compian stated that the commission could work on resources in conjunction with the city. Compian noted that the city has listed many resources, but that there is a significant number of other resources available in response to COVID-19. Compian said that there is \$1.8 million in funding available to pay for utility assistance as well as rental assistance, available for those at as much as 200 percent of the poverty level. Compian noted other resources available for assistance and said the commission should be "a conduit" for identifying and promoting to the community. Commissioner Brown said she can share resources they have available on the commission's Facebook page. Compian said that the Knights of Columbus would host a food distribution event on June 20. Compian also stated that a meeting will be held by the Ministerial Alliance of the police chiefs. Commissioner Kimberly Yancy said that the meeting is of area police chiefs and was to discuss police issues. Compian asked that information be directed to Commissioner Brown. Brown said that she would post any community events. Public Relations Specialist Colleen Merritt said that the city is not promoting events as the city is not permitting mass gatherings due to COVID-19. Compian and Brown asked for clarification and if food distribution events were allowed. Merritt said that food distribution events and other "contactless" assistance events were allowed. Compian asked for publication of funding assistance online. Merritt said she would partner with the commission for publicizing those items. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

- b. Discussion/possible action regarding reimbursement of Keep Texas Beautiful affiliate dues of \$175 and Governor's Award submission fee of \$25



Chairman Compian said that when he had submitted the Governor's Award that there was a fee of \$25 and that the affiliate dues had not been reflected as paid. Commissioner Brown asked if the fees had been reflected as paid because she had received a past due notice. Compian asked Bryce regarding the payment. Bryce stated that a check had been sent for dues by the city but that he would research the matter further. Compian stated the item could be deferred. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

- c. Discussion/possible action regarding KLMB Commission recognition as a Silver Affiliate and requirements for Gold Affiliate recognition in 2020

Chairman Compian stated that the item was for information for goals to reach Gold Affiliate status. Compian said that increasing youth outreach was important, and that he would be forwarding ideas to the commissioners. Commissioner Brown said that Earth Day events were cancelled due to COVID-19 this year, but that the event should take place next year. Brown also said that she is working with others in the city to engage youth and start after school programs that Keep Texas Beautiful can join in conducting. Compian said activities are only for the 2020 term and that online activities will also qualify. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

- d. Discussion/possible action regarding Keep Texas Beautiful affiliate recognition schedule and 2020 training and meetings

Chairman Compian discussed upcoming seminars and other meetings related to Keep Texas Beautiful. **NO ACTION WAS TAKEN**

(10) CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Chairman Compian discussed COVID-19 and the diversity of the representation in La Marque and on the commission. He also discussed responding to trash left at construction areas along Interstate Highway 45.

Merritt discussed sharing the Silver Certificate Affiliate Award on social media, and that a video is available regarding the Governor's Award on the La Marque YouTube page. Merritt also discussed sharing of resources through the city.

(12) REQUESTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner Brown said she would like to discuss a Fall Sweep safely with COVID-19 and asked for discussion of the event to be placed on the next agenda. Commissioner Herrin discussed La Marque's business assistance programs, and a clothing closet at nursing homes in La Marque. Commissioner Steans discussed a kids program for piano and other musical instruments during COVID-19 at Small Events at 1215 1st Street. Commissioner Yancy discussed COVID-19 issues and online events. Commissioner Mould asked if there is a Halloween community even the commission participates in with the city at an area parking lot.



Commissioner Brown said the commission participates with the La Marque Public Library for activities. Council Member Casey McAuliffe said she was happy to meet with the commission again and discussed the death of George Floyd. McAuliffe encouraged questioning and discussing policies going forward. Chairman Compian said that some jurisdictions have started community discussions on Zoom regarding being better neighbors. Compian also stated that the commission will follow-up on McAuliffe's comments.

Chairman Compian stated would come back with a proposal related to this item at a future meeting. He noted the challenge of keeping updated information available. Commissioner Brown stated that she will post testing sites, food bank events and share city information on the commission's Facebook page.

Chairman Compian asked if Bayou Fest would be held this year. Supervisor Van Stavern said the event is being discussed. Compian said that the item would be carried over to another meeting to discuss a formal date and backup.

NO ACTION WAS TAKEN

- b. Discussion/possible action regarding purchase of 10 "No Littering" signs at a cost of \$45.00 each for a total amount not to exceed \$450
Chairman Compian asked Supervisor Van Stavern for a presentation on the item. Van Stavern stated that the existing signs have all been used, and that some signs are faded, and that new signs would be provided for additional areas of the city. Commissioner Brown asked if more than 10 signs are needed. Van Stavern answered that the city will start with 10 new signs. Chairman Compian asked if Code Compliance still utilizes trail cameras to catch illegal dumping and littering. Van Stavern answered that the division depends more on citizen calls to identify litterers and illegal dumping. Brown made a motion to approve the purchase of 10 "No Littering" signs in an amount not to exceed \$450.00. Commissioner Mould seconded the motion.

(10) CHAIRPERSON'S REPORT

Chairman Compian reported that he had been at home due to COVID-19. He also discussed bottles and trash in work areas along Interstate Highway 45.

(11) PUBLIC RELATIONS REPORT

(12) REQUESTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

Commissioner Brown announced that traffic had increased slightly on the Keep La Marque Beautiful Facebook page. Commissioner Steans had no announcements. Commissioner Yancy challenged the commission to offset negative press for the city. Commissioner Pettijohn discussed the amount of children out in his neighborhood. Commissioner Mould inquired about supplying wipes, tissue paper and other items to area schools in the coming school year. Commissioner Brown suggested holding a drive for supplies. Chairman Compian suggested bringing that matter forward at the next meeting. Commissioner Yancy stated that school is starting programs on August 5, and that school funding will be tied to being open and said that hand sanitizer and other items are needed.

(13) REQUESTS FOR FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS

Commissioner Brown requested an item to discuss a bayou clean-up event and holding a clean-up event twice a year, including the possibility of holding an event two weeks before Bayou Fest. Brown also requested an item to discuss the formation of an organization tied to the commission to plant flags along Bayou Road on Memorial Day and other holidays. Chairman Compian said he would include that as a discussion item of future events. Commissioner Yancy requested an item to discuss support of the purchase of property being sold by Texas City Independent School District for a park or operations center. Chairman Compian stated he would include that as discussion of future events, and that land purchases would require city council approval. Yancy asked for a resolution of support.

(14) ADJOURNMENT

Commissioner Brown made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Mould seconded the motion. **MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY**

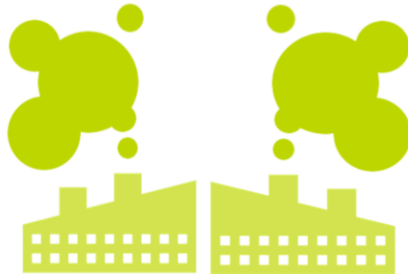
