1. CALL MEETING TO ORDER

Chairman Mike "Rock" Bock called the meeting to order at 4:15 p.m.

3. INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Board Member Mike Wev voiced a prayer and all attended voiced the Pledge of Allegiance.

4. NEW BUSINESS

4.1. Discussion regarding the projects to come out of the Capitol Projects Fund
City Manager Cesar Garcia started with a mention of the 30,000 dollars that is allocated to both Keep La Marque Beautiful and the Parks Board and how the rollback affected this balance. However, with the help of Finance Director Christine Turner, we are getting back on track.

He mentions that there are four separate accounts for the Parks Board:

1. The Park Maintenance Account (also called the O&M account)

This account covers payroll for the Parks Foreman and staff and the parks' maintenance. This account is under Public Works Director Rick Sailer's direction.

2. The Park Surge Fund

It was noted that this account shows odd balances and a large sum of money. However the Finance Department is aware of large purchase such as playgrounds among other expenditures that are not reflected. This account will be updated with all pending journal entries. There is good news. There is a lot of money in this account, and it will have money for the upcoming boat ramp project.

3. Capital Fund Account (also called Fund 66)

This is the mandatory \$2.000 Park User Fee reflected on water bills. This account funds all capital projects.

4. Donation Account

This account is for any donations received through the additional \$2.00 donation selection available on water bills.

City Manager Garcia mentioned discussions surrounding the creation of a 5th account through the Houston Galveston Area Council, a 501(c)3 that would be a donation account through the third party, the City would not be in control of this account. He also suggested promoting the donation election through utility billing.

Chairman Bock suggested to put an insert in the water bill to promote the donation fee. The use of a QR code was also suggested to be used on the water bill.

***Finance Director Turner was excused from the meeting at 4:42 p.m.*

City Manager Garcia began discussions for the next year's budget and how much to use for the year's projects.

Projected Capital Fund projects are additional playgrounds, a walking path at Bayou Park, fencing at Bayou Park, and basketball equipment.

City Manager Garcia recommended keeping three numbers in mind "How much money we have? How much we can spend? Is there another number to put aside to invest to plan for the following year?"

The Boat ramp for Mahan Park is projected to be \$450,000. The Boards share is 125,000.00.

Two grants were offered this year, one for parks and one for trails, the one on the following regular meeting agenda is for trails.

Chairperson Bock asked if there a staff member dedicated to searching for grants? City Manager Garcia stated that the city utilized a company that is always searching for grants for different areas of the city.

It was established that the Highland Bayou bulk head will be a priority for the coming year as well as the Bird Sanctuary repair. The Board has \$300,000 to spend on Capital Improvements.

Discussion ensued regarding the need for repairs at the Mahan concession stand. It was suggested to tear down the concession stand and rebuild a building.

Three press boxes were identified at Mahan Park leading City Manager Garcia to question why the Board did not want to rebuild the fields and concession stand.

Chairman Bock requested a timeline for an interlocal agreement with Texas City Independent School District to utilize their soccer, tennis, and baseball fields.

City Manager Cesar Garcia suggested a football and soccer field at Highland Bayou Park, with a clover field at Mahan park.

Vice-Chairperson Tonia Griffin said that the shade structures at Westlawn and Bayou Park are eligible for the Capital Projects Fund.

City Manager Garcia listed his top 10 projects for completion: Highland Bayou shoreline, Saltgrass Park, Bird Sanctuary, Mahan's concession stand and press boxes, receiving a quote for Mahan fields, Bayou and Westlawn shade structure, Pickleball at Highland Bayou, Jaycee Park, Mahan concrete surfacing, updating Kids cusp to code, and removing the playground at Highland Bayou Park.

SECTION 6 - AWARD AND PAYMENT

- A. The Department will provide funding to the Sponsor in an amount not to exceed \$470,475.00 for the project described under Project Description and Location above and in accordance with the Department-approved budget summary attached.
- B. The Sponsor shall obtain prior approval from the Department for budget and program revisions, and shall request reimbursement via payment in accordance with the most current version of the Instructions for Approved Projects Recreation Grant Programs on form PWD BK P4000-1146.
- C. In order to receive a financial assistance award and to ensure proper payment, it is required that Sponsor maintain their registration with the System for Award Management (SAM), accessed at <http://www.sam.gov>. Failure to maintain registration can impact obligations and payments under this Grant Agreement and/or any other financial assistance or procurement documents the Sponsor may have with the Federal government.
- D. Expenses charged against awards under the Grant Agreement, unless approved in Section 3, may not be incurred prior to the beginning of the Grant Agreement and may be incurred only as necessary to carry out the approved objectives, scope of work and budget with prior approval from the Department Key Officials. The Sponsor shall not incur costs or obligate funds for any purpose pertaining to the operation of the project, program, or activities beyond the expiration date stipulated in the award.
- E. Indirect costs will not be allowable charges against the award unless specifically included as a line item in the approved budget incorporated into the award.
- F. The Sponsor must meet their cost share commitment over the life of the award, as specified in section 2 of this agreement. Non-federal cost-share is required for costs incurred under this Grant Agreement.

SECTION 7 - MODIFICATION, REMEDIES FOR NON-COMPLIANCE TERMINATION

- A. This Agreement may be modified only by a written instrument executed by the parties. Modifications will be in writing and approved by the Department and the authorized representative of Sponsor.
- B. Additional conditions may be imposed by the Department if it is determined that the Sponsor is non-compliant with the terms and conditions of this agreement.
- C. The Department may suspend program assistance under the project pending corrective action by the Sponsor or pending a decision to terminate the grant by the Department.
- D. The Sponsor may unilaterally terminate the project prior to the first payment on the project or within 90 days of the TPWD Approval Date, whichever occurs earlier. After the initial payment, the project may be terminated, modified, or amended by the Sponsor only by agreement with the Department.
- E. The Department may terminate the project in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of completion, whenever it is determined that the Sponsor has failed to comply with the conditions of the grant. The Department will promptly notify the Sponsor in writing of the determination and the reasons for termination, together with the effective date. Payments made to the Sponsor or recoveries by the Department under projects terminated for cause shall be in accord with the legal rights and liabilities of the parties.
- F. The Department or Sponsor may terminate grants in whole, or in part, at any time before the date of completion, when both parties agree that the continuation of the project would not produce beneficial results commensurate with the further expenditure of funds. The two parties shall agree upon the termination conditions, including the effective date and, in the case of partial termination, the portions to be terminated. The Sponsor shall not incur new obligations for the terminated portion after the effective date and shall cancel as many outstanding obligations as possible. The Department may allow full credit to the Sponsor for the State/Federal share of the non-cancelable obligations, property incurred by the Sponsor, pending written receipt of the determination and the reasons for termination, together with the effective date. Payments made to the Sponsor or recoveries by the Department

under projects terminated for cause shall be in accord with the legal rights and liabilities of the parties.

- G. Termination either for cause or for convenience requires that the project in question be brought to a state of recreational usefulness agreed upon by the Sponsor and the Department, or that all funds provided by the Department be returned.
- H. If the Sponsor does not comply with provisions as set forth in the grant agreement and the Recreation Grants Manual regarding both active project compliance and compliance at previously assisted grant sites, the following actions may be taken:
 - 1. The Department may withhold payment to the Sponsor;
 - 2. The Department may withhold action on pending projects proposed by the Sponsor

SECTION 8 - CLOSEOUT

Sponsor will follow closeout procedures in the Instructions for Approved Projects Recreation Grant Programs PWD BK P4000-1146.

SECTION 9 - TERMS OF ACCEPTANCE

By accepting funds under this grant, the Sponsor agrees to comply with the terms and conditions of this Grant Agreement, and the terms and conditions of all attachments that are applicable to the Sponsor. Sponsor also agrees to comply with assurances and certifications made in its approved grant application submitted via Recreation Grants Online, and applicable federal statutes, regulations and guidelines. Sponsor agrees to fulfill the grant in accordance with the approved grant application, budgets, supporting documents, and all other representations made in support of the approved grant application.

Signature Authority

The person or persons signing this Grant Agreement on behalf of the Sponsor hereby warrant and guarantee that they are duly authorized by the Sponsor to execute this Grant Agreement on behalf of the Sponsor and to validly and legally bind the Sponsor to all the terms of this agreement.

Entire Agreement; Modifications Must Be in Writing

This Grant Agreement and each of its provisions will be binding upon the parties and may not be waived, modified, amended or altered unless with prior written approval by both parties.

Venue; Governing Law

This Grant Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Texas. The proper place of venue for suit on or in respect of the Agreement shall be Travis County.
