Minutes of the Regular Meeting Minutes of La Marque City Council held on Monday, July 11, 2016 at 6:00 p.m. at 1109-B Bayou Road for the purpose of considering the following agenda:

- (1) Mayor Hocking called the Regular Meeting to order at 6:03 p.m.

- (3) **INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**
Mayor Hocking provided the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.
- (4) **PRESENTATIONS, PROCLAMATIONS AND RECOGNITIONS**
 - a. Proclamation - 20th Annual "Golden Ribbon Award" Recipient
Mayor read a proclamation and recognized "Mama Frances Soul Kitchen" as one of the recipients of the Golden Ribbon Award awarded by the Galveston County Health District for their outstanding attention to health practices in their La Marque Restaurant.

- (5) **CITIZEN'S PARTICIPATION**
 1. Catherine Polk, "Usually I come before you with compliments, but tonight, I have both, compliments, and a concern, verging on the side of a complaint. Thank goodness you are putting in the newspaper, about the trash collection for holidays. For the other compliment, the other blue can garbage collection, those drivers are great. My concern is the Wednesday trash pickup. For instance, last week, Tuesday afternoon, I put out all the trash cans with all the lawn stuff in them, well, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday came and they were still sitting there, they picked them up this morning about 11:30. Now, the question is, are they going to come back on Wednesday. The first time, I called to get on the schedule, I was told I no longer need to get on the schedule. I am discovering that our citizen don't know the rules. At one time, the bundles had to be tied up, then for a few years that wasn't necessary, now all of the sudden they are insisting on that again. I ran out of cans and had to put one of my piles out without a can, and the driver told me quote, "We are not allowed to pick that up." She suggested that in the water bills, when

- there is a permanent change of schedule or change of rules, to include it in with the water bills.”
2. Dale Templet commented, “If Les was doing his job, I wouldn’t be here. I called City Hall and talked to Patty about water. I have had water in my house six times since 12.16.14.” He continued to say that a meeting was set up for he and Les to meet, and the meeting didn’t take place. A message had been left on the answering machine stating the machine was messed up. The following day, he and Les met up along with a few City workers that showed up, and they were supposed to shoot an elevation grade. Further stated that Mr. Brown had been by a few times taking pictures where water had gotten into his house. He referred to some flower beds he felt were illegal in the neighbor’s yard. He has spoken to other staff members, about some raw sewage in his ditch. He submitted pictures to staff.
 3. Maggie Manuel thanked the Mayor for placing the Republic Services item on the agenda. “I have a petition, I would like to submit to the City Clerk.” She read the subject line of the petition. (Attached as Exhibit “A”).
 4. Tracey Honish, Dale Templets’ daughter, “He has had water issues over the years. Mainly he wanted me to mention tonight, that he does keep his property up, he still mows his yard, and he is eighty-one years old. While edging the other night, he fell in his driveway. He had to lay there until the neighbors came and got him. He lives alone, and he is doing the best he can. If you all can help him with the flooding issues that would be great.”
 5. Terrie Kirkland, “I am also his daughter, I live in Dickinson, but I have been observing this. If it was your parent or grandparent what would you all do to help him out?”

Mayor Hocking commented, “Any man or woman should be proud to have daughters like you that will come and speak on behalf of their parent. That can sometimes be rare in this day and age. Mrs. Buttler would you see to it that this is put on the absolute front burner and these issues are addressed until the property owner or citizen is satisfied.”

6. William Sowell spoke on behalf of the La Marque Cougars organization. And said that the Tiger and Cougars joined together to become a significant Little League program in La Marque. “We have put in the application to have our practices and games in Mahan Park. We have been there for about twenty-two years. We are going to do an excellent job in keeping the fields up and following the rules. We have great experience out there on the field in little league programs. We are trying to rebuild the positive attitude here in La Marque. We appreciate the fact that you all will allow us to go and out and take care of the kids, because contrary to what people think, La Marque is still going to be here and La Marque is still going to exist and these kids are the future.”

Point of information, Mayor Hocking announced that there will be a Workshop on the 18th of July concerning this subject and a few more items, with this being an action item on that agenda.

7. Geraldine Sam said that the City needs to do a better job in getting the trash picked up in the City. "The brush on my street was just picked up after being out there for months and months. There are still piles on my street that haven't been picked up for months. I don't want La Marque to be trashy. I have lived in La Marque going on sixty-five years, and I want to be proud of this City. But when I have family and other friends and cousins and people that I am doing business with and they come into the City and they see all the trash. This is not a good example."
8. Mark Sumrall commented, "I have a very good report and I am sorry that Republic left. I was here at the last Council meeting, and I was very frustrated. As of three o'clock today, all of the leaks have been taken care of. The rubbish that had been out on the side of the road, outside my residence for the past three weeks, was picked up some time after three o'clock today. It is very nice to stand before the Mayor and the Council to say to see the Council and Mayor working for the citizens of La Marque."

Mayor Hocking closed the Regular Meeting and opened the Public Hearing at 6:24 p.m.

Geraldine Sam asked whether the funds would be used for the old or the new Fire Station to which Chief Grimm replied that the funds would be used, as necessary for either station.

- b. Conduct Public Hearing to hear public input regarding Ordinance No. **O-2016-0010**, amending City of La Marque Code of Ordinances Chapter 44, Article I, Section 44-14, Noises as Public Nuisances.

No one spoke.

Mayor Hocking closed the Public Hearing and reconvened the Regular Meeting at 6:29 p.m.

(8) NEW BUSINESS

- a. Discussion/possible action regarding the termination of Republic Services Municipal Solid Waste Contract invoking the minimum 30-day "cure period," as provided in the contract, with a proposed contract termination date of December 31, 2016.

Steve Carroll, the Municipal Service Manager for Republic Services began, "I have been here before, and we have dealt with each other for the past ten years. Certainly we understand and will abide by the City's decision to move forward and we also wanted to point out, prior to that decision, that Republic has done over the last six weeks to try to meet with the City and actually amend some of the contractual requirements to make collection easier and to make collection of the larger brush items that seem to be such a bone of contention, easier. About six weeks ago, Mr. Calvin Ray, who is the General Manager of Republic Services, Southeast Houston, and I met with Mrs. Buttler and Mrs. Girndt, about how we can pick up heavy trash more efficiently, or how we could make the heavy trash to where it is not such a heavy burden on the City and the residents. At the meeting, two glaring deficiencies came out, number one, nobody like the "list". So, Mr. Ray asked if the "list" was eliminated, and if it is on the ground, that Republic would pick it up. It was agreed that this would be a giant step forward. Secondly, there were some contractual requirements in the contract, which called for cut and bundled, which called for certain length of limbs, and green waste and again Mr. Ray had asked if these requirements were suspended, and that if was on the ground, our guys would pick it up. So at that meeting, we established that we were going to pick up, what we run are routes, and each route has about a thousand homes, and we were going to take each route on a Wednesday or a Saturday, and about four to five grapple trucks were going to be used to clean up everything in that route. We provided the City with route maps in advance so that the City could notify the citizens as to which routes they would be working and when. I believe we worked that for five weeks. Then Mr. Ray had suggested to Mrs. Buttler and Mrs. Girndt to move forward after we had "swept" into setting twenty percent of the City which would get service on a weekly basis with a picker truck and a rear load truck to service "heavy" on a schedule. So we had a tacit agreement that this would help in moving the City forward, so we sat out on that course. I believe that it is still in progress, but last week, Mr. Hollins, our route supervisor provided the City with the permanent maps on what we were going to do on a go forward basis. We gave Ms. Buttler some copies of some contracts and some RFP's from other areas, that we had seen and been involved with, that had some really good language that the City might actually decide to adopt at some point that would be much simpler than what we have now. We were receiving feedback from the drivers that people were coming up to them thanking them for picking up the brush, and other debris while moving forward towards a permanent solution. If the piles were too large, it was suggested that the piles be documented, and if we picked them up, the City would reimburse us. We are providing a level of service at this particular point which is over and above what we were providing six weeks ago. We certainly do recognize and respect the decision of the City Council. We will be in contact with Mrs. Buttler or Mr. Ortego in the coming week to basically get a list of specific allegations of breach by the City and a specific cure schedule, so that we can move forward on a positive note."

Councilmember Brown commented, "We have known each other for a long time, why is it that your people don't pick up what they are supposed to? Do they not see it, or don't want to? This has happened not only in my district but in the others as well. This is what has gotten you in trouble. This needs to be cleaned up and walked away from."

Mr. Carroll responded, "I understand, Mr. Brown and we agree. We are working on an amicable solution with the City on getting it cleaned up. We are working to get it cured."

Councilmember Michetich said that he had received complaints on branches that were placed in the blue cans, but stuck out over the top, and they were not picked up and Mr. Carroll apologized for that and said that there was no excuse for that.

Mayor Pro-Tem Bell said, "It is good seeing you again. I wish you and your company the best in moving forward, but I do have some concerns." He then directed his concerns to Mr. Calvin Ray. Mr. Ray introduced himself and added, "The action plan that we put together was to overcome some of the things that had transpired in La Marque in years past, that service above what we were willing to do to take care of the City. We didn't ask for any money, we didn't ask for anything."

Mayor Pro-Tem Bell continued, "I don't know if that's true, Mr. Ray, if you will allow me to finish, but I am glad that you are here as well, and welcome to the Gulf Coast." Then he referred to another time, when Republic Services had been at a previous Council meeting. "We have patiently tried to explain the issues that were concerning our residents, this is not the first time that you have been here. My first question, is how many meetings have you had either in this Council Chambers, with Council as a body, with the Mayor or with the City Manager as it relates to the dysfunction of your operations?"

Mr. Carroll replied, "We have met on several occasions on service issues, and perceived service issues, basically trying to get to a point to where the Council and the citizens were pleased with the efforts that the company was putting forth, and that has been a number of times."

Discussion continued as to the length of time that the issues with trash and brush pickup service have been less than adequate, the requirements of preparing the brush piles to be picked up, and the citizens' inability to meet some of those requirements.

Mayor Pro-Tem continued, "You brought on a person six weeks ago to resolve an issue that has been in existence for a twenty-four month period, of frustration with our citizens, and that's a big problem. One problem is the large piles. We had agreed to the manner in which we are to prepare our brush. A lot of our citizens are unable, and some true are unwilling to prepare these piles in a way that it would be satisfactory to you or your company, and we are suffering for it."

Discussion continued as to how much revenue is generated from the recycling portion of the operations, within the City. Recycling is paid for by the company, the representatives disclosed. Previously, commodities fluctuated according to the oil prices and other reasons, but as of this date, no revenue is generated. Reference back to an earlier statement about billing the City for the pickup of extra size piles was discussed at length. These charges were currently outlined in the contract, in which it was questioned why to charge in the first place, since the City was so dissatisfied with the current lack of adequate service that the City is receiving.

Mr. Ray answered a few questions pertaining to portions of the current contract. "If we strictly stuck to the verbiage of the contract, we wouldn't have offered the City an opportunity for us to step outside. Run the extra route at no extra charges, take away the restriction of bundling the branches."

Further discussion included changes that have occurred within the last six weeks in the service provided to the citizens. Incorrect billing issues, missed handicap pickups, consistent mishandling of carts, extensive delays on parts of carts, inability to accommodate special pickups, miscommunication between the Republic organization and the citizens and the City staff were a few of the issues briefly discussed. Occasionally delays in pickup routes due to unforeseen weather issues, resulting in different times of pickups was discussed.

One of the drivers of Republic Services approached the podium and added reasons why they would be on the streets sometimes as late as 8:00 p.m. for dispatched orders to the drivers as a missed pickups.

Mayor Pro Tem finished by saying, "You know I love you Steve Carroll, but enough is enough."

Mayor Hocking commented, "First being, Steve Carroll has been an exemplary representative of Republic Services in the five plus years that I have served as Mayor, going above and beyond. Secondly, it seems that it began to change and this is just my opinion, when the cities to our north were contracted with, which would be League City and Dickinson that our service began to diminish. Thirdly, the action taken tonight if action is taken would be to invoke the thirty-day "cure" that we have contractually to notify you in writing, that there is a thirty-day "cure" being invoked. We would hope that that would come to some further understanding of the problem and those ten breaches that staff and legal have prepared would certainly be included in that notification letter. Number four, I have actually adopted a pile of brush at the corner of Ross and Howell that my four year old grand-daughter could have picked it up and put in the small wagon, but I chose not to call in on it, I wanted to watch it for several months. I don't think as of today that has been touched, it seems to me that a company with a landfill located in our City, the place you do business, the place that we have quite frankly helped you with vacating roads, and expanding your company, and you know Mr. Carroll that I have done everything within my authority and in my power along with this Council to help Republic

Services that piles like that would just be “picked up”. How many times does that truck drive by that pile each week? We should be one of the cleanest cities in Galveston County because your business is located here. That is just my humble opinion. That petition that was promulgated earlier tonight, we had no idea that a petition was going around the City, and in just two or three days, we have almost two hundred signatures, including former Councilmembers, Boards and Commission members, and including residents from all districts and that is an indication that something is not right. Once again, Mr. Carroll you have been a tremendous blessing to the City of La Marque, Mr. Ray, I am sure that you would have been, Mr. Kline, I know that you have tried to respond under the authority in which you serve under. To the drivers you do a great job.”

Mayor Pro-Tem Bell made a motion to invoke the minimum 30-day minimum “cure period” with Republic Services, as provided in the contract, to be formalized in the letter of notice required by the contract enumerating breaches that must be cured during this 30-day period, then read the ten breaches of the contract (Attached as Exhibit “B”) Councilmember Michetich seconded. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

- b. 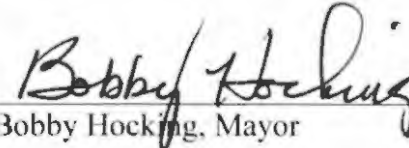
