(3) INVOCATION AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Pro-Tem Bell led the invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance

(4) PRESENTATIONS/ PROCLAMATIONS

- a. Introduction and Administer Oaths to new Police Officers – Mayor Hocking administered the Oath of Office to Stephen Leacroy and Vincent Ramirez and Police Chief Jackson introduced them along with the new Telecommunicators - Alisa Espitia and Angel Fontenot all attendees were invited to go into the Community Room for cake and refreshments for a reception.
- b. Proclamation - “Black History Month” – February – Mayor Hocking presented Vera Bell-Gary, a member of the African-American Historical Preservation Committee of the 1867 Settlement and member of the Galveston County Historical Commission with a Black History Month Proclamation.

(5) CITIZENS PARTICIPATION

1. Bill Pritchard spoke of a water line on his street, and said that the valve has rotted off and the line hasn’t been flushed in a long time. He said that the address is 2424 which drains into the bayou and limbs and trash in the culvert, so it can drain properly. Off of 519 onto Newman, the limbs hang into the road and asked if someone could trim them.



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2. Hugh Cash, spoke of the Animal Services Contract with Galveston County. "They only have two agents that work all of Galveston. At any one time, they really only have one on shift. I have an animal that I keep on a tether." He proceeded to report that his subdivision is a dumping ground for strays and a breeding ground for wild animals. Mr. Cash asked if someone could remind the County that the City is under contract with them and that we want to be provided the services that the City is paying for. "That means coverage when we need it and security and safety of our animals, and enforcing the rules."
3. Deannie Barrett spoke of the donation that Clean City Commission and the Parks Department. "During the years, it has gone down tremendously, and I was aware of how much the donations had dropped while I was on the Clean City Commission. At one time, we were collecting \$2,696.00 per month, it dropped to \$414.00 when we went to the billing. I have been informed that we cannot change it, where it says amount due; and that shows just the water bill. If we are paying the contractor for this service, why can't we put it on there, because the City is losing money on this, because the Parks Department takes care of all of the parks with its' money. Clean City is trying to get grants to clean this city up, and to me, the citizens are not getting represented right, because ya'll are not billing the things right." She said if the City was paying for this service that it should be able to dictate what is on the amount due.

** Councilmember Lane seconded. **THE ORIGINAL MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

Councilmember Michetich wanted the public to be aware that one of the permits was denied previously (last year), due to some inaction and having multiple and numerous homeowner association meetings, but that this has been rectified. Pictures were shown of tree plantings in the easements that have proven to be a problem, in tearing up the roads and sidewalks, holding the city responsible to maintaining those trees once the developer sells that property. Asked that a caveat be made that of those 19 instances, allowing the developer thirty (30) days to start those repairs, even if it takes the re-pouring of those nineteen sidewalks and be given ninety (90) days to complete the repairs. "If that is not done, I want a stop work order on all of their development. I don't think that this is unreasonable, because it has been almost a year since we first we went through this. They had agreed to stop planting the "street trees" and they are still doing that."

** Councilmember Michetich made amendment to the motion (see above)

** Councilwoman Mc Auliffe seconded. The amended **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

- f. Discussion/possible action regarding adopting Resolution No. **R-2018-006**, authorizing the City Manager to accept the award for Office of the Governor Criminal Justice Division (CJD) Grant number 3488401 for the Rifle Resistant Body armor Grant program in the amount of \$31,500.

** Councilmember Michetich made a motion to amend Article VI, Landscaping of the City of La Marque Code of Ordinances to prohibit planting of any street trees in the City's rights-of-way / easements

** Councilmember Lane seconded.



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Councilmember Michetich presented some pictures on slides, showing broken sidewalks from “street trees” being built in the city’s easement between the sidewalks and the streets. He suggested drafting a revision to our existing ordinance that will give new development builds with stipulations and or variances in the revitalization area for maybe allowing the planting of box plants.

Councilwoman Mc Auliffe agreed to an extent with Councilmember Michetich, but would like to see it used to leverage higher standards for the developers. “I am not in favor of the prohibition of planting “street trees”. There are many ways to approach this problem, there are other cities experiencing the same issues that are using different approaches to solve this same exact problem. I feel like it would be a real loss to say without looking further into what can we say and what can we do and what kind of leverage can we have over our developers. I would like to talk about this. I would like to look at some other options before we move forward.”

Mayor Hocking appointed a Tree Committee, with Councilmembers Michetich and McAuliffe chairing the Committee. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

- h. Discussion/possible action regarding proposing an ordinance to require LED streetlights in all new development and providing direction to City Manager.
- ** Councilmember Mc Auliffe made a motion to provide direction to the City Manager whether to propose an ordinance to require LED streetlights in all new development.
- ** Councilmember Lane seconded.

Councilmember Michetich said that as street lights go out within the City, CenterPoint is replacing them with LED lighting. “When it’s a development, typically, the street lighting is paid for by residents through their own homeowners association dues, because this is a cost to them and of course electric companies make money off of them, but CenterPoint has come around. We can require the developers as they come to the city for the developer to fund the street lighting. If the utility company is willing to do it, and it’s a minor upgrade charge to the developer or if the utility company just takes it on everywhere. It saves money and they are safer.”

It was asked how much it would cost the homeowners, which was said to be a few hundred dollars. There is a certain amount (allotment) of street lights that is per agreement with CenterPoint, (60-80 per year). The City’s burden would be if the City paid for the street lights. It was said that all should be all replaced with LED lights within the city as a whole, if an expense was going to be passed along to the residents in the newer subdivisions. It was the consensus of Council to move forward in having all LED street lighting and however we can accomplish that we should do it. It was asked for a resolution showing that



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the City will be moving forward to move to LED lighting not only in new subdivisions but also in the existing parts of La Marque.

- i. Presentation, discussion/possible action regarding schedule and status of Water and Sanitary Sewer Capital Improvements Program projects and provide further direction to City Manager

Chaise Cary gave an update of current projects and presented a power-point (Attached as Exhibit "A") showing reports that identified problem areas within the City's Sanitary Sewer lines, and also outlined the areas of problems in Water Line replacements areas of the future projects that have yet to be funded, those that are in the process and also the locations where the repairs and replacements have been made. Meter replacements, water line replacement programs and other items relating to CDBG projects were also discussed.

Public Service Director Les Rumburg gave an update of the MOTCO water line that the City has reasons to believe has leaks in it. It is a six inch water line that serves the MOTCO Supersite. "They were advised about a year ago to find an alternative way in which to service their facilities with water, because we were going to disconnect the six inch line. The City offered an alternative solution that involved a third take point and establishing a line from that take point. At that time, it appeared to be \$115,000.00 to \$125,000.00 venture and it wasn't discussed how that would be funded, but the hopes that they would end up funding most. When Hurricane Harvey came and priorities changed and with the TX DOT proposed changes along the I-45 corridor widening, that investment would have to be moved. MOTCO has had over a year and half to find an alternative water source, I am looking for your direction. The two options I presented to them, was funding the entire project by themselves, or the idea of trucking the water in on an as needed basis."

It was the consensus of Council to go over their head.

(11) APPOINTMENTS/ASSIGNMENTS

Mayor Hocking said this was a Mayoral appointment, and made that appointment. Councilmember Michetich seconded. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY**

- b. Discussion/possible action regarding appointments and/or reappointments to fill vacancies to various positions of the Boards and Commissions.

City Manager Carol Buttler said that she had received applications, and she had two slots. She recommended Lucy Glenn to take position 1; and Randy Scates taking the other position (3). "So there is a full commission."

Councilwoman Mc Auliffe made a motion to approve the recommendations.



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Councilmember Michetich seconded. **MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY.**

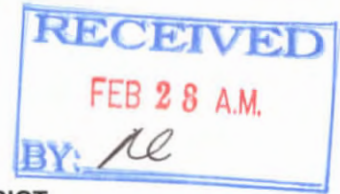

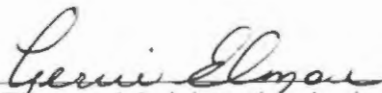
Dear Ms. Eldridge:

As providers of the county funded Mosquito Control Program, we are requesting your approval of the enclosed resolution authorizing the aerial spraying for mosquitoes. The Federal Aviation Administration requires us to make a request on a yearly basis. This request does not imply any change in our operations.

ORDINANCE NUMBER O-2018-002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS LEVYING A SPECIAL ASSESSMENT ON CERTAIN PROPERTY IN PUBLIC IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT NUMBER ONE, PAINTED MEADOWS SECTION V

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of La Marque, Texas (the "Council") passed and approved Resolution Numbers 966 and 967 dated August 11, 2003, authorizing the establishment and creation of the City of La Marque Public Improvement District Number One (Painted Meadows); and

WHEREAS, by action on April 25, 2003, the Council approved a service and assessment plan for Public Improvement District Number One; and

WHEREAS, the total costs of an improvement project for Public Improvement District Number One have now been determined and reviewed by the City's auditors; and

WHEREAS, a proposed assessment roll incorporating the costs of the public improvement project has been prepared and is on file with the City; and

WHEREAS, the City Council called a public hearing to consider the proposed assessments, directed that the proposed assessment roll be filed with the City Clerk and made available for public inspection during ordinary business hours of that office; and

WHEREAS, notice by mail and publication of the public hearing having been given as required by law and the hearing having been held by the City Council on this 12th day of March, 2018, at which time all objections were heard and passed on;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, THAT:

Section 1. The Service and Assessment Plan containing the total cost of the improvements for Section Five Residential, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof, is hereby approved. The apportionment of the cost of the improvement shall be made on the basis of special benefits accruing to the property because of the improvement.

Section 2. A special assessment of \$4,154,000.00 (\$1,550.00 per annum) distributed evenly per lot is hereby levied on such property located in Public Improvement District Number One - Section V, consisting of 134 single family lots, all as described on the assessment roll, attached hereto and by this reference made a part hereof.

Section 3. The assessment will be paid annually in approximately equal installments over a 20 year period commencing no sooner than calendar year 2018 and no later than calendar year 2022

and will be delinquent if not paid by January 31 following each calendar year. The assessment shall bear interest at the rate of 0.331% per annum.

Section 4. An assessment, with interest, the expense of collection and reasonable attorney's fees, if incurred, is a first and prior lien against the property assessed, superior to all other liens and claims except liens or claims for state, county, school district, or municipality ad valorem taxes, and is a personal liability of and charge against the owners of the property regardless of whether the owners are named.

Section 5. The lien is effective from the date of this Ordinance until the assessment is paid and may be enforced in the same manner that an ad valorem tax lien against real property may be enforced by this governing body.

Section 6. The owner of assessed property may pay at any time the entire assessment, with interest that has accrued on the assessment.

Section 7. The facts and opinions in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct. The contents of the notice of public hearing, which hearing was held before the City Council immediately prior to consideration of this ordinance, and the publication and circulation of said notice is hereby ratified, approved and confirmed.

Section 8. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Ordinance shall for any reason be held to be invalid or unenforceable, the invalidity or unenforceability of such section, paragraph, clause or provision shall not affect any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance.

Section 9. It is hereby found, determined and declared that a sufficient written notice of the date, hour, place, and subject of the meeting of the City Council at which this Ordinance was adopted was posted at a place convenient and rapidly accessible at all times to the general public at the City Hall of the City for the time required by law preceding this meeting, as required by the Open Meetings Law, Section 551, Texas Government Code, as amended, and that this meeting has been open to the public as required by law at all times during which this Ordinance and the subject matter hereof has been discussed, considered and formally acted upon. The City Council further ratifies, approves and confirms such written notice and the contents and posting thereof.

Section 10. Pursuant to the provisions of Article II, Section 21 of the City Charter, and in light of the adoption of this Ordinance by an affirmative vote of a four-fifth (4/5) majority of the Council members present, this Ordinance may be published by caption only.

Section 11. All ordinances and agreements and parts of ordinances and agreements in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict only.

At the request of Randy Hall I am providing you with documentation regarding the \$1,550 annual payments to be made by each of the homes for the assessments in Painted Meadows, PID No. 1, Phase V. The calculations below are based upon the findings in the "audit" provided by McGrath & Co., PLLC in their letter to the Economic Development Corporation dated December 21, 2017.

I have also spoken with Randy Hall and he concurs that the \$1,550 per lot is consistent with the developer's business plan for Phase V.

The \$1,550 per annual payment is derived as follows:

- Total reimburseable cost (per the McGrath & Co., PLLC letter are \$3,336,401).
- An assumed interest rate of 2.185% annual interest rate (which is much less than the Prime plus 2% annual interest rate that is allowed per the original documents – in this case the developers will not be able to receive all the interest that is allowed per the Painted Meadow PID No. 1 documentation). Also you should note that Prime plus 2% has never been as low as "2.185%".
- Assume that the assessments will be amortized/paid for over a 20-year period of time (which is consistent with the PID payment structures for included in the PID Painted Meadows PID No. 1 documentation and is also consistent with what has been done in Painted Meadows PID No. 1, Phases II, III, and IV).
- The total annual payments for all 134 lots based upon the assumptions included in the previous 3 bullet points would amount \$207,704 per year.
- If we divide the \$207,704 per year by the 134 lots located in Painted Meadows, Phase IV then the annual payment per homeowner is \$1,550 per year per homeowner.

Does Council want to include the west side of Bayou for the commercial properties in the original zone or in a future zone?

Does Council wish to waive all, some, or no fees involved with developing properties within the zone?

HISTORY:

- A Neighborhood Empowerment Zone initially was recommended in the City's Middle Income Housing Pilot Study by Marsh Darcy Partners as a goal to address blight reduction within the proposed revitalization boundaries.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS, CREATING A NEIGHORHOOD EMPOWERMENT ZONE COVERING A PART OF THE CITY; MAKING CERTAIN FINDINGS; DESCRIBING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE ZONE; WAIVING CERTAIN FEES; AND AUTHORIZING CERTAIN AGREEMENTS TO ABATE CITY PROPERTY TAXES IF CERTAIN BASELINE PERFORMANCES ARE MET.

WHEREAS, Chapter 378 of the Texas Government Code authorizes the City to create a neighborhood Empowerment Zone; and

WHEREAS, the City Council hereby determines that the creation of a Neighborhood Empowerment Zone would promote:

- (1) the creation of affordable housing in the Zone;
- (2) an increase in economic development in the Zone;
- (3) an increase in the quality of social services, education, or public safety provided to residents of the Zone; or
- (4) the rehabilitation of affordable housing in the Zone. **NOW THEREFORE**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LA MARQUE, TEXAS:

That a Neighborhood Empowerment Zone is hereby created, the boundaries of which are described as follows:

(to be determined by City Council)

That the creation of the Neighborhood Empowerment Zone benefits and is for the public purposes of increasing the public health, safety, and welfare of the persons in the City.

That the creation of the Neighborhood Empowerment Zone satisfies the requirements of Section 312.202 of the Tax Code.

That the City may waive or adopt fees related to the construction of buildings in the Neighborhood Empowerment Zone, including fees related to the inspection of buildings.

That the City may enter into agreements abating municipal property taxes on property in the Neighborhood Empowerment Zone subject to the duration of Section 312.204, Tax Code provided that the baseline performance standards are met, such as the Energy Star Program as developed by the Department of Energy, to encourage the use of alternative building materials that address concerns relating to the environment as to the building costs, maintenance, or energy consumption.

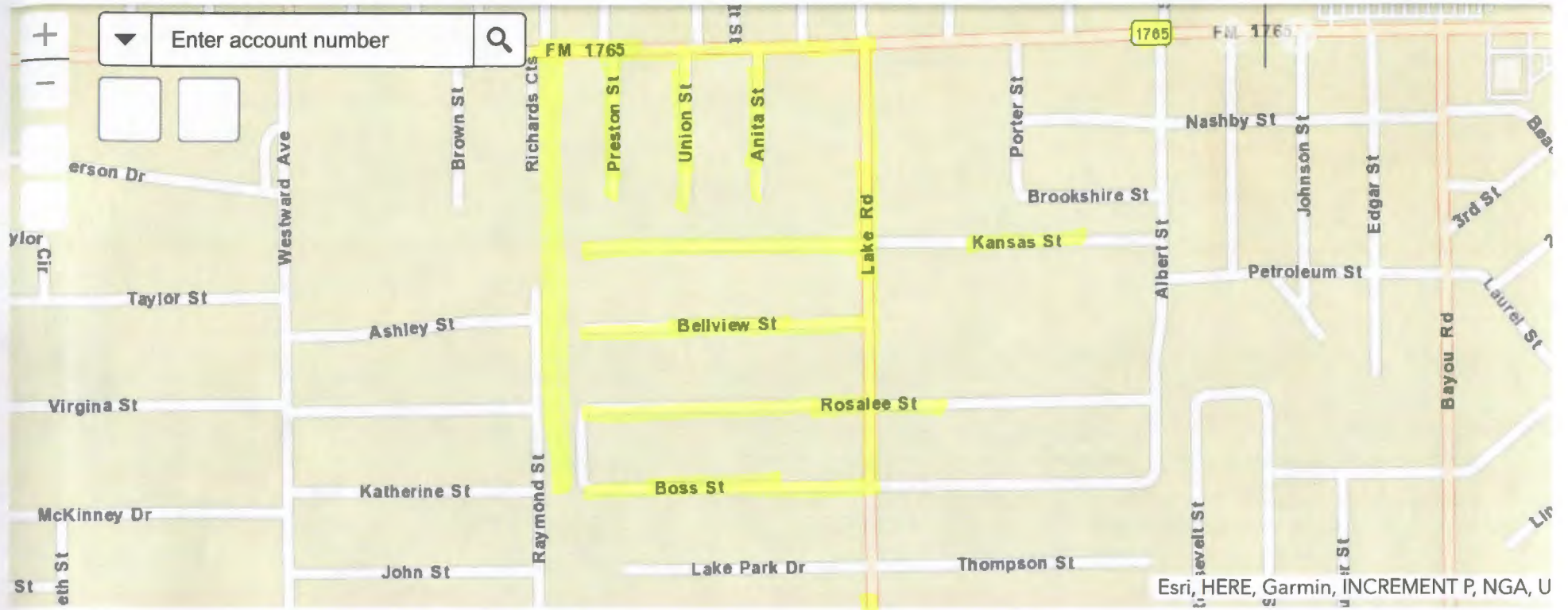

After viewing the existing physical condition of the area, MDP determined the boundary of the Study Area, the broad area near the five city-owned lots that has similar physical conditions. The determination of the Study Area was intended to provide a look at the extent of deteriorated tax base in and around the city-owned lots.

Starting at FM 1765 and moving south along Lake Street it becomes evident that at or near Boss Street conditions of properties transition and improve. The same can be seen moving east along FM 1765 from Lake Street passed Preston. The broader Study Area boundary was defined as FM 1765 south along Lake Street to Boss Street and Lake Street east along FM 1765 to the west side of lots fronting on Preston as shown on the map below.

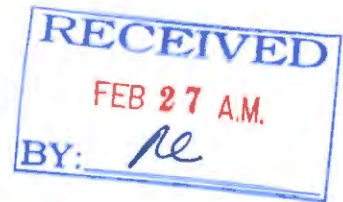

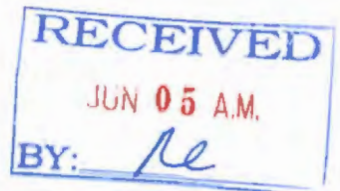
